Dear Commissioner Colvin.

Last month, Community Legal Services, the Homeless Advocacy Project, and Juvenile Law Center recommended a change to Social Security Administration (SSA) policy to allow youth transitioning out of foster care to apply for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits nine months before discharge. As we explained in our letter memorandum, this change would ensure that this vulnerable group is able to access benefits without delay upon discharge to ease the transition to adulthood.

Since our previous letter, numerous state and national groups have signed on to support the recommended policy change. These organizations, which serve thousands of foster children across the country, express strong support for this policy change and are confident in its potential to significantly improve the transition to adulthood for youth aging out of foster care.
