Standing Order Authorizing Sharing of Information With School Personnel

Standing Order No.: 06-04

This standing Order addresses the exchange of information between the Fresno County Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) and personnel at any school or school district. The Court hereby finds it to be in the best interest of any child who comes within the jurisdiction of the juvenile dependency court to facilitate the sharing of information about the child, which will aid in that child's education.

Pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 202, 300.2, 362.05, 827, and 16001.9, the Court hereby finds that it is important for children to receive an appropriate education and that DCFS can help facilitate the educational process by sharing relevant information about a child with appropriate school officials to help maximize the child's education and educational opportunities.

The Court further finds that it is in the best interest of children covered by this Order and in the public's interest to have timely sharing of appropriate information and to avoid the delays

and inefficiencies of individual authorizing Orders for each child covered by this standing Order.

Therefore, this Court hereby authorizes and Orders as a standing Order of this court the following:

- 1. This Order applies to children who come within the jurisdiction of this court and for whom DCFS has information covered by Welfare and Institutions Code section 827 or Penal Code section 11165 et seq.
- 2. DCFS may disclose to appropriate school personnel, including but not limited to, superintendents, administrators, principals, teachers, nurses, and specialists any relevant information it has concerning a child who is attending or seeks to attend a school, and which will aid in the child's education. This information may include, but is not limited to, the child's name, birthdate, address, placement, careproviders, medical condition, special needs, mental health status, and dependency status.
- 3. Any school official receiving information from DCFS pursuant to this Order shall limit the use of the received information to assisting in meeting the educational needs of the child and shall not disclose the received information to non-school personnel, except as otherwise authorized by law or further Order of this court.
- 4. This Order shall be effective upon filing with the Juvenile Court Clerk's Office.
