Transition-Age Youth (TAY) Civil Legal Practice Exchange

The TAY Civil Legal Practice Exchange (TAY PX) is a practice support network for civil legal advocates across California that convenes regularly to share resources, exchange technical assistance, develop referral pathways, and identify recurring issues related to the civil legal needs of transition-age young people (roughly ages 16-25). The TAY PX provides monthly training, bi-monthly workshops, bi-monthly office hours (a more interactive, collaborative space to brainstorm and problem-solve around recurring issues in TAY advocacy work across the state), a listserv, and a dedicated resource library. We've found that membership in the TAY PX is especially useful for newer attorneys and attorneys interested in learning more about the unique civil legal needs of transition-age young people.
