

VOTING RIGHTS OF YOUTH IN JUVENILE FACILITIES

DID YOU KNOW THAT YOUTH IN JUVENILE FACILITIES CAN

Young people in California can vote if they are:

- A U.S. citizen and California resident
- 18 years old or older on Election Day

Does a felony juvenile case matter for voting? NO! A youth in the juvenile system that meets the eligibility requirements above can vote. Juvenile adjudications don't impact voting rights.

CLAIM YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE:



- Check to see if you're already registered here:
 https://voterstatus.sos.ca.gov/
- If not, fill out a registration form:
 - Register online: registertovote.ca.gov
 - Or request a registration card from the <u>county elections office</u> or Probation.
- Info needed for registration:
 - Date and place of birth
 - Personal identification of EITHER
 - Driver's license or ID card #, OR
 - Last 4 digits of Social Security Number
 - Home address
 - Mailing address (use the juvenile facility address if you will be there on election day)
- <u>Register at least 15 days before Election Day.</u>

2022 Deadlines: Register by: Oct. 24, 2022

Vote on or before: Nov. 8, 2022

Step 2: Request a ballot

 Request a "vote by mail" ballot as part of your voter registration or from the <u>county elections office</u>.

☆☆☆

• <u>Request your ballot at least 7 days</u> <u>before Election Day.</u>

Step 3: Vote!

- Check out the Secretary of State's Voter Guide: <u>voterguide.sos.ca.gov</u>
- Or visit <u>Voter's Edge CA</u> for local info.
- Sign, date, and seal the envelope. Your ballot is confidential.
- Mail your ballot by Election Day.

If you're unsure about your voting rights, ask your defense attorney or call the voter hotline.
