





Advocacy Tool to Support Reproductive Health Care Access for Young People with Experience in Foster Care

This list of prompts was developed to help state advocates navigate the current state of affairs as it relates to access to reproductive care and abortion for youth in foster care. This list is intended to help advocates identify existing rights as well as the challenges in their states so that they can develop a plan for advocacy.

The first column provides a question or prompt. The second column provides information on available resources that may help you answer the question, and whether additional state law and policy research is needed. Note that some of these issue areas will not have answers as the law may not yet be clear. The third column provides a space for you to provide the response to the prompt. We hope that the answers and information you input in the third column will help guide your advocacy efforts.

At the end of the document we have included additional information and resources, including where to go to receive technical assistance.

What steps will or should child welfare agencies take before a youth is placed out of state to ensure that their reproductive rights are protected?	This requires analysis and advocacy.

Will youth be able to purchase the abortion pill by mail if their state has banned abortion? If yes, what resources exist to cover the cost?
